

9 STEPS OF INTERCESSION

REPENT:

- If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord won't hear me. (Psalm 66:18)
- Before we go before the throne of God on behalf of others, we must have clean hands and a pure heart.

RELATIONSHIP CHECK: (first with God, then with others)

With God

- Am I putting Him first in my life?
- Am I trusting Him fully?
- Am I spending time in His Word?
- Am I obedient to the leading of His Spirit?

With Others

- Is there anyone I need to ask for forgiveness?
- Is there anyone I need to forgive?

PRAISE AND WORSHIP:

- God inhabits the praise of His people. When we praise, He comes near.
- Liberty is produced when God's Spirit is present.

DIE TO SELF:

- To hear from God we have to get ourselves out of the way.
- Dead people don't have to have things their way.
- When we die, Christ can fully be in charge.

INVITE THE SPIRIT:

- Invite the Holy Spirit to guide you as you pray.
- If we follow the leading of the Spirit, we will pray perfectly in God's will.
- If we ask anything according to His will, it shall be done.

SUBMIT AND RESIST:

- Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee James 4:7

TAKE ON THE ARMOR:

- Loins Girt about with Truth (love truth)
- Breastplate of Righteousness (protect my heart from evil)
- Feet Shod with the Preparation of the Gospel of Peace (bring peace where I step)
- Shield of Faith (covering me from fiery attacks)
- Helmet of Salvation (protect my mind)
- The Sword of the Spirit (God's Word)

WAIT AND LISTEN:

- His sheep know His voice. (John 10:4) We must have times of listening for that 'still, small voice'.
- When I only pray for the things I want to pray about, I am not submitted. Therefore, God is under no obligation to answer, and the enemy is under no obligation to flee.

OBEY:

- Now, we do what God says.

ARMOR OF GOD

“Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God” ~ Ephesians 6:13-17

1. Loins Girt about with Truth (love truth) A girdle is a very important piece of the armor. Historically, its purpose was to allow ease of movement by holding other garments in place. Prayer: Lord, as I gird my loins round about with truth; allow Your word to saturate my very being so Your Truth-the Word of God will keep me from lies or error. Give me a love for your Word.

2. Breastplate of Righteousness (protect my heart from evil) This piece of armor acts as a filter for our hearts. “The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?” (Jeremiah 17:9) We must guard our eyes and ears from worldly things; anger, jealousy, and pride. Prayer: Lord, as I put on the Breastplate of Righteousness, I ask You place a guard over my heart. Please do not allow destructive thoughts or words to find a lodging place in my heart, which could cause a root of bitterness, jealousy or pride. “Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.” (Psalms 51:10)

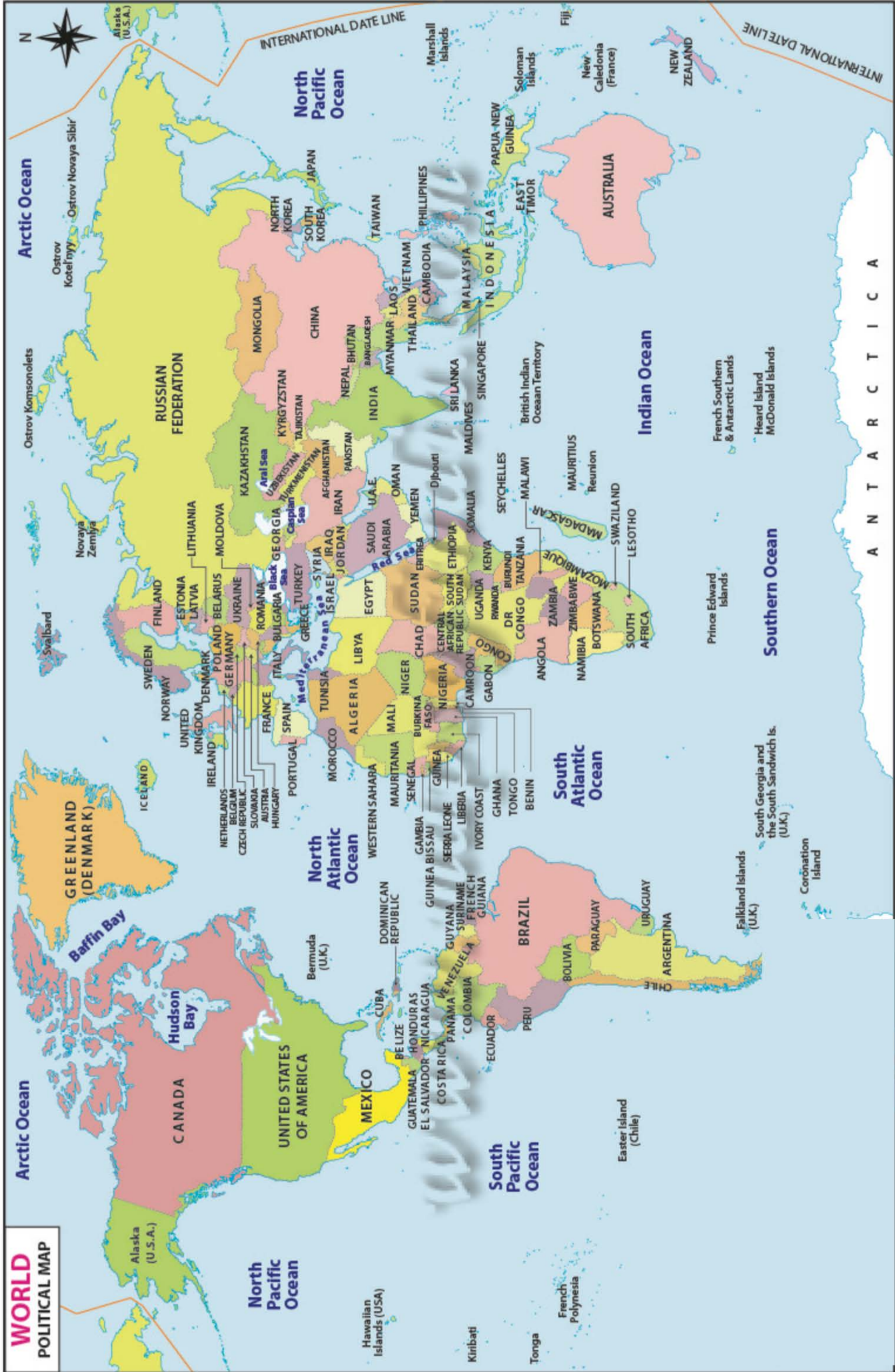
3. Feet Shod with the Preparation of the Gospel of Peace (bring peace with every step) This piece of armor is a spiritual act of putting on the boots. Boots of peace that will carry The Good News to the hurting, sick and dying. Prayer: Lord, I ask You to direct my path today; where my feet will walk. Protect my feet and “set them in a large place safe from the pit.” Send the angels to keep me from stepping or stumbling in a hard place, hurting or “brushing my feet against a stone.”

4. Shield of Faith (covering me from fiery attacks) This piece of armor shields us from the fiery darts of the wicked one as we put our faith in the Lord. We have all been given a measure of faith; put it into action here each day. Prayer: Lord, above all, as I take up the Shield of Faith to quench all the fiery darts coming my way this day, I pray You help my unbelief. Allow me to have great faith today. Let me cover the holes of doubt or unbelief in my shield, which I cannot see, but my enemy can. I trust in You, for You are the “author and finisher of my faith.”

5. Helmet of Salvation (protect my mind) This piece serves to protect our eyes and mind. We must guard our eyes from worldly things; what we see can seriously affect us spiritually. Prayer: Lord, as I take up the Helmet of Salvation please keep my mind focused on You. I cast down my imaginations and every high thing that exhales itself against the knowledge of Christ Jesus, bringing every thought captive to Your obedience. Place a guard over my eyes. Let the mind of Christ be in me and let me see others as You see them, precious Lord.

6. The Sword of the Spirit (God’s Word) Anoint the Word in my hand, my heart and my mouth. When I’m in trouble, quicken your Word to my mind. This piece of armor is the only “offensive” weapon we have to fight the enemy. Prayer: Lord let me love Your Word so that it may be written upon the “table of my heart.” Let Your Word flow through me so I can rightly share Your good news. Anoint my hands as they handle Your Word, and let it find a lodging place in my heart.

HOW TO PRAY FOR MISSIONARIES/AIM WORKERS

DAY 1 - RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

- Love and study God's Word.
- Have a strong prayer life.
- Be filled with the Holy Spirit.
- Be maturing spiritually.
- Make progress over personal sin.

DAY 2 - PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL NEEDS

Satan often discourages us through our physical and emotional lives. Many missionaries live in difficult climates filled with disease. Pray for good health. With busy and hectic schedules, missionaries travel often. Pray for safety, stamina and a sense of priority. Remember that preventive prayer helps. The wise thing is to cover your missionary's health continually. Pray against discouragement, loneliness and depression.

DAY 3 - FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS

Pray for family relationships—husband/ wife, parent/child. Pray for the children, their salvation and spiritual growth, their health and education. Pray too that their family life will provide an excellent model for local Christians and the unsaved. Pray for strong, healthy friendships and contentment in singleness.

DAY 4 - ABILITY TO COMMUNICATE

In world evangelization communication is crucial. Your missionary is in ministry to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. Whether your missionary is communicating with his life or lips, he must be understood. Learning a new language and adapting to a new culture are frustrating, difficult and essential to good communication. Languages in the Far East are among the most difficult for a Westerner to master. Even an elementary knowledge of a language takes years of study and practice. But to really communicate, the missionary must adapt culturally to identify with those he is trying to reach. Getting close to the local people and understanding them means adjusting lifestyle and cultural preferences. Pray that your missionary will have the stamina and understanding to demonstrate Christ cross- culturally.

DAY 5 - EFFECTIVE MINISTRY

Sometimes you can forget why your missionary is overseas, and why you are praying for him. Remember to pray for what your missionary is actually doing: witnessing, visiting, teaching, preaching, counseling, nursing—and pray for the people he is ministering to. Prayer letters will teach you how to specifically pray for these things. But include requests for boldness, open doors, open hearts and excellence in the effort. Most of all, ask the Holy Spirit to empower your missionary for productivity. (See John 15:16.)

DAY 6 - TEAM RELATIONSHIPS

Your missionary is probably not completely on his own. Normally, missionaries team up with other missionaries, local believers, pastors and evangelists. Unfortunately, this mix of personalities designed to strengthen the ministry can sometimes be used of Satan to weaken it. Poor team relationships can spoil the work. Pray for all the fellow workers your missionary mentions in his letters. Pray they appreciate and sharpen one another in good and healthy ways.

DAY 7 - COUNTRY OF SERVICE

Expand your praying to include the entire country where your missionary is located. The political situation, the government and its leaders, visas, freedom to preach the gospel— all of these are important factors in world evangelization. You can also pray that the whole country will open up in responsiveness to the gospel.

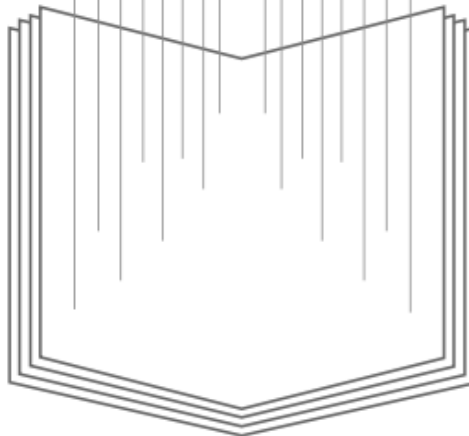

PRAYING THROUGH THE BOOK OF ACTS

1. for a spirit of prayer to permeate the church. "These all continued with one accord in prayer" (Acts 1:14).
2. for empowered witnessing. "Ye shall receive power ... and shall be witnesses" (Acts 1:8).
3. for a spirit of "one accord" to prevail among the church. "When the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place" (Acts 2:1).
4. for the outpouring of the Holy Ghost. "I will pour out of my Spirit on all flesh" (Acts 2:17).
5. for the fear of the Lord to rest on the church. "fear came upon every soul" (Acts 2:43).
6. for boldness in Jesus name. "Such as I have give I thee: In the Name of Jesus ..." (Acts 3:6).
7. for apostolic giving. "The multitude of them that believed were of one heart ... neither said any of them that ought of the things which he possessed was his own" (Acts 4:32).
8. for an increase of signs and wonders among us. "... many signs and wonders wrought among the people" (Acts 5:12).
9. that we will give ourselves to apostolic priorities. "But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word" (Acts 6:4).
10. for apostolic evangelism and bold preaching. "Philip went down to the city ... and preached Christ. ... and there was great joy..." (Acts 8:5, 8, 40).
11. for Damascus road conversions. "Who art thou, Lord? ... I am Jesus" (Acts 9:5).
12. for devout believers to know what they ought to do. "A devout man, and one that feared God with all his house, which gave much alms to the people, and prayed to God always" (Acts 10:2).
13. for a spirit of praise to come on the church for what God is doing among so many. "When they heard these things, they held their peace, and glorified God" (Acts 11:18).
14. for protection of the ministry from harm and danger. "Herod the king stretched forth his hands to vex certain of the church ... but prayer was made" (Acts 12:1).
15. for the church to pray without ceasing. "prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God" (Acts 12:5).
16. for the Holy Ghost to send anointed missionaries. "As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted. ... So they, being sent forth by the Holy Ghost, departed" (Acts 13:2, 4)
17. for the apostolic spoken word of faith to be manifested among us. "The same heard Paul speak: who stedfastly beholding him, and perceiving that he had faith to be healed, said with a loud voice, Stand upright on thy feet. And he leaped and walked" (Acts 14:9- 10).
18. for apostolic unity. "Being assembled with one accord. ... it seemed good to the Holy Ghost, and to us" (Acts 15:25, 28).
19. for the churches to be firmly established in the faith and to increase in number daily. "And so were the churches established in the faith, and increased in number daily" (Acts 16:5).
20. for minds to be open to receive the Word and search the Scriptures. "they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the Scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11).
21. for inspired vision to increase faith for reaching many people in our cities. "Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by a vision, ... I have much people in this city" (Acts 18:9-10).
22. for a sweeping revelation of baptism in Jesus' name. "When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 19:5).
23. for the Holy Ghost to fall, the Word to be effective, and for the name of Jesus to be magnified. "The Holy Ghost came on them; and they spake with tongues. ... God wrought special miracles. ... Jesus was magnified." (Acts 19:6, 11, 17, 20).
24. for passion among believers. "I ceased not to warn every one night and day with tears" (Acts 20:31).
25. for commitment to the gospel and the name of Jesus. "Then Paul answered, What mean ye to weep and to break mine heart? for I am ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 21:13).
26. for a cheerful spirit in the midst of trying situations. "the Lord stood by him, and said, Be of good cheer" (Acts 23:11).
27. that all adversity becomes an instrument of revival. "There came a viper. ... and he shook off the beast into the fire. ...so when this was done, others ... came" (Acts 28:3, 5, 9).

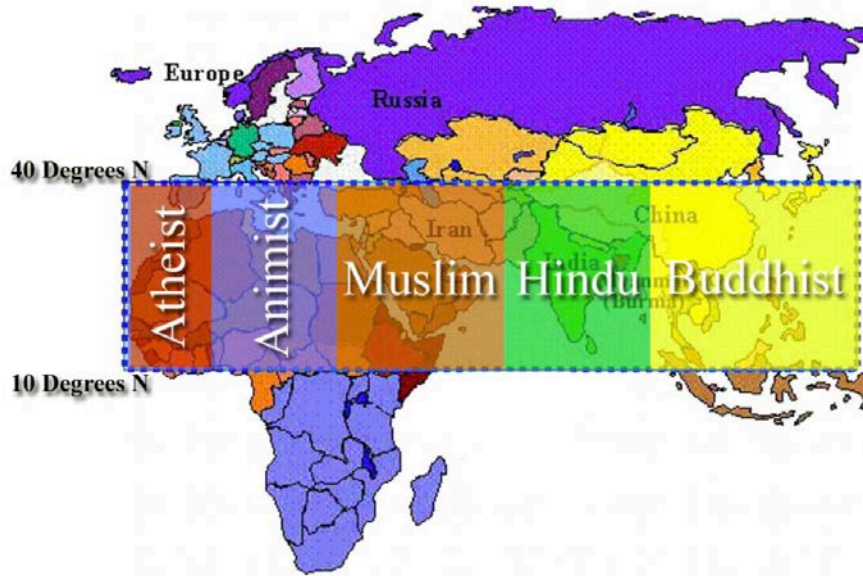

Sobering Facts

- All these people groups have less than 2% Christ-followers and have very limited access to the Gospel.
- One in five people on earth live in these 50 unreached peoples.
- These 50 unreached people groups are comprised of 1.41 billion souls.
- Every group is larger than 10,000,000 in population.
- None have an indigenous church capable of taking the Gospel to the entire group.
- Primary religion: 22 are Muslim, 18 Hindu, 5 Buddhist, 3 Ethnic Religions, 1 non-Religious, 1 Sikh.
- 46 of these 50 unreached people groups are in the 10/40 Window, 43 are in closed countries.
- For every dollar of Christian resources less than a penny is directed at reaching unreached people groups.



2/3 of the world's population



The 10/40 Window is located from 10 degrees south to 40 degrees north of the equator. There are **69 nations** across northern Africa, the Middle East and Central Asia in the 10/40 Window. Nearly 4 billion people live here, including 90 percent of the world's poorest of the poor. It is estimated that 1.6 billion of these people have never had the chance to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ - not even once!

The seat of every major non-Christian religion - Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, Animism, Atheism, and Sikhism - is headquartered in the 10/40 Window. Two-thirds of the world's population (4 billion) live in the 68 nations of the 10/40 Window.

- Two-thirds of the world's population — 4 billion people — live in the 10/40 Window.
- 95% of these 4 billion people are unevangelized.
- 87% are the poorest of the poor, living on an average of only \$250 per family annually.
- In many of the **69 nations**, witnessing the Christian Gospel is illegal and will result in imprisonment or death.
- 45 of the 50 worst countries in the world for persecution of Christians are in the 10/40 Window.
- Child prostitution and **child slavery** run rampant in many of these nations.
- Horrific abuse of women and children remains unchecked.
- A majority of the world's terrorist organizations are based in the 10/40 Window, and children as young as 18 months old are trained to be Jihad soldiers.

Though the needs are both and desperate and urgent, **only 5¢ out of every \$100** spent on missions globally is directed toward the 10/40 Window. That's **0.0005%** of all missions money designated to bring the Gospel to **66%** of the world's population!
