

Christa Sarra's September 2018 AIM Report



September 3-9 (Week 1)

Andrea Roberts and I stepped off of a long series of flights to meet a fellow AIMer, Anthony. We ran to the bus stop to catch one of the last buses to Ventspils. When I stepped into the city I could already feel the burden. It felt like home. After taking some time to get adjusted, we began Revival by Design training. The information has shown to be invaluable. After training was finished, the team headed back to Riga to attend a conference. I got to experience evangelism in a park with another AIMer from Estonia. We also made an important connection with a pastor from a different denomination that lives in Ventspils!

September 10-16 (Week 2)

This week was filled with fasting and prayer walks. We walked around the major streets and sections of the city praying and asking God to open doors and lead us to hungry people. We began to meet contacts that the team made over the summer to make connections with them and move them into Bible studies. We were invited to come to the service of the pastor that we met the previous week. He asked anyone who was willing to testify to come up and I was able to share about the several times I have witnessed miraculous healing in my life.



September 17-23 (Week 3)

Becoming more comfortable within the city gave me more confidence in evangelism. This week I made eight new contacts. I continued to keep up with the contacts from over the summer and stepped into more administrative duties. At this point, three of the team members are "new" to the team and were also trying to figure out how to work as a unified body. We were invited to spend more time at pastor Kaspers church! This has put us in contact with the Romani population in Ventspils. So far we have been connected to the college-aged groups, high school aged groups, and now the Romanis! God is doing wonderful things in Ventspils.

September 24-30 (Week 4)

This week we experienced a physical healing in our team service that we hold on Sunday morning! Rachel Brush had a notable curve in her arm that the doctors deemed as incurable. God miraculously provided her an extra centimeter of movement! We are believing God for continued healing. This week was rainy most of the time, so it was difficult to simply meet people on the street. However, time spent in coffee shops and cafes provided us with the opportunity to come in contact with new people and those we had previously met. Even though the weather was not cooperating, God still allowed work to be done! By the end of next month we are expecting people to be filled with the Holy Ghost and to have a house church started by the end of October.
