The month of August has been absolutely flooded with things!

We started off the month with the 75th anniversary of the beginning of the Warsaw Uprising. The streets were filled with people waving flags, bearing the Uprising symbol, and a general feeling of national pride. At exactly 5pm, the entire city froze. Every tram and bus stopped where it was and cars were parked in the middle of the streets. We stood on a sidewalk with dozens of other Varsovians as every driver in the city held down the horns on their vehicles for exactly one minute. This minute was the moment when the Home Army launched the Uprising in 1944.

This moment will be one that I will never forget. I stood weeping because of the intense feeling of unity. I could never explain just how incredible this moment was. This city amazes me.

The next day, we and part of the AIM team from Latvia traveled down to Kraków to meet the ALJC missionaries there. We had a wonderful time making connections and finally trying kielbasa (Polish sausage)! We joined them for service and fellowship. God is doing wonderful things in Kraków!

This month, two of our team members returned to the States. We are so sad to see them go, but we know God is directing their steps! Next week, two more team members will be arriving for training.

God answered two prayers for healing! One was for myself after I fell off of a motor scooter. Of course, I'd be the one to fall. Haha! The other was for my friend and Polish teacher, Magda, who had suffered a sprained ankle.

I am amazed at all that God is doing in my life as well as this beautiful country. Every day is a new adventure and a new lesson about the Lord, people, and ministry. He has opened doors to new friendships and helped us connect to people groups that we never thought we could reach.  
He is a faithful God!

Please pray for strength and favor for Paulita and I as we work towards obtaining our residency here in Poland. It is a very stressful and long process.
